1. Introduction

This plan is based on the <u>contingency framework for managing local outbreaks</u> of COVID-19 and the <u>schools operational guidance</u>, provided by the Department for Education (DfE).

We will only implement some, or all, of the measures in this plan in response to recommendations provided by our local authority (LA), directors of public health (DsPH), Public Health England (PHE) health protection team or the national government.

It may be necessary to implement these measures in the following circumstances, for example:

- > To help manage a COVID-19 outbreak within the school. Actions will be considered when either of the following thresholds are met:
 - There are 5 positive cases amongst pupils or staff who are likely to have mixed closely within a 10-day period
 - 10% of pupils or staff who are likely to have mixed closely test positive within a 10-day period
- > If COVID-19 infection rates in the community are extremely high, and other measures have failed to reduce transmission
- > As part of a package of measures responding to a 'variant of concern' (VoC)
- > To prevent unsustainable pressure on the NHS

2. Seeking public health advice

When one of the thresholds above is met, we will review the testing, hygiene and ventilation measures already in place.

We will also seek public health advice from a director of public health or health protection team. K.Chadbourne will be responsible for seeking this advice, and will do so by telephoning the DfE helpline (0800 046 8687) or SRSMAT and DCC.

3. Shielding

We will adhere to national guidance on the reintroduction of shielding, which would apply to those on the shielded patient list (SPL).

We will speak to individuals required to shield about additional protective measures in school or arrangements for home working or learning.

4. Other measures

Parents, carers, pupils and staff will be informed promptly about the introduction of control measures. This will be done via Class DOJO once a decision has been made.

If recommended, we will limit:

- > Residential educational visits
- > Open days
- > Transition or taster days
- > Parents coming into school
- > Live performances

If recommended, we will (re)introduce:

- > Testing, including the use of an asymptomatic test site (ATS)
- > Bubbles, to reduce mixing between groups
- > Face coverings in communal areas and classrooms for staff and visitors (unless exempt)

5. Attendance restrictions

Attendance restrictions will only be recommended as a last resort. If recommended, we will implement the measures in this section.

5.1 Eligibility to remain in school

If restrictions are recommended, we will stay open for:

- > Vulnerable pupils
- > Children of critical workers

5.2 Education and support for pupils at home

All other pupils will be required to stay at home and will receive remote education.

We will aim to deliver remote education that meets the same quality and quantity of education that pupils would receive in school, as outlined in our <u>Recovery Curriculum and Remote Learning Provision 2020-2021 St Joseph's Catholic Primary (saintjosephsschool-matlock.co.uk)</u>

The school will continue to provide meals or lunch parcels for pupils eligible for benefits-related free school meals while they are not attending school because of COVID-19 isolation guidelines.

Details will be sent to eligible parents via Class DOJO.

5.3 Wraparound care

If required, we will limit access to before and after-school activities and wraparound care during term time those that need it most.

We will communicate who will be eligible to attend once the restrictions are confirmed.

5.4 Safeguarding

We will review our child protection policy to make sure it reflects the local restrictions and remains effective.

We will aim to have a trained DSL or deputy DSL on site wherever possible. A DSL will always be able to contacted remotely.

When vulnerable pupils are absent, we will:

- > Speak to parents/carers and, where applicable, social workers and the local authority, to work out the reason for absence
- Encourage attendance
- > Make sure vulnerable pupils can access appropriate education and support while at home
- > Maintain contact, and check regularly that the pupil is able to access remote education provision

Covid Outbreak Contingency Plan – Sept. 2021

We understand that during the summer holidays many of the Covid 19 restrictions have changed. Below are the current guidelines we as a school will be following, with plans for how we will adapt measures if necessary.

When should my child self-isolate or miss school?



All children MUST attend school unless they are ill.



- From 16th August 2021, children under 18 (or double-vaccinated adults) do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household or a contact, has Covid.
- Instead, they will need to book a PRC test but can continue coming to school so long as they have no symptoms and the test result is negative.





- If your child develops Covid symptoms at home, they should <u>stay</u> at home and should book a PRC test), <u>NOT</u> a Lateral Flow test.
- If your child develops Covid symptoms at school, they will be sent home and you should book them a PRC test.
- If your child tests positive for Covid, they will need to self-isolate.
 The rest of the household does not need to self-isolate if they are under 18 or fully vaccinated but instead should book a PRC test.

- been no cases of Covid within school for 10 school days.
- Cases of Covid locally are low and/ or stable.
- Hospitalisation/ Deaths due to Covid nationally are low.

No Covid measures are necessary beyond:

- Reminding children of good hand-hygiene.
- Continuing with current enhanced cleaning schedule within school.
- Ensuring good ventilation encouraged where practical.
- Ensuring Children / Staff to stay at home if they have Covid Symptoms (and to book a PCR test).

Staff will continue to test themselves using Lateral flow tests until the end of September, when this guidance is due to be reviewed.

A single child tests **Positive**

- A single child tests positive for Covid in a class.
- There are fewer than 5 cases in the class.
- No other year groups are affected.
- The child self-isolates for 10 days. Remote learning will be provided if they are well enough to complete it as outlined on the website or work packs are sent home remote-education-policy-for-st-josephs-catholicacademy-matlock-updated-jan-2021.pdf (primarysiteprod-sorted.s3.amazonaws.com)
 - The parents of the child are contacted directly by NHS Track and Trace to establish likely contacts.
- Likely contacts will be contacted by NHS Track & Trace and advised to book at PRC Test. The school will contact parents to advise this if close contacts are known.
- Children do not need to miss school or self-isolate whilst they wait for the result of the PRC test unless they have Covid Symptoms.



5 children or staff within a class test positive within 10 days of each other.

- There have been 5 cases of Covid across a class within 10 days which could mean that Covid is spreading within that group of children.
- As above for each positive case.
- The school will discuss the outbreak with SRSCMAT /DCC and Public Health England and agree strengthening protective measures for 10 school days, including:
 - Encouraging the use of face masks in corridors and communal areas
 - Adapting, Limiting or postponing indoor sporting events, trips, open days and performances.
 - Reverting to Collective Worship via MS Teams
 - Reducing the amount of classes staff work across.
 - Additional enhanced cleaning schedule arranged

The school will inform parents of any changes to Covid measures should these be needed.
